OVERVIEW OF TREATMENT

Schick Shadel Hospital is a multi-disciplinary treatment for chemical dependency. Our treatment combines the usual counseling and group therapy with medically supervised and controlled aversion counter conditioning and rehabilitation interviews. We have used this approach for 75 years, having opened in Seattle, Washington in 1935. We have treated thousands of patients in those years and have the highest success rate of recovery in the United States.

The aversion conditioning is accomplished with a degree of nausea induced by a medication presented in association with the sight, smell and taste (not ingestion) of the addictive drug. The conditioned aversion achieved in this manner provides the opportunity to be free of the craving for the addictive drug. It also breaks the conditioned responses that tend to push one towards drinking or using drugs. Permanent abstinence from addictive drugs is the goal of our treatment program.

The second relatively unique treatment approach in our multimodal therapy involves giving a sedative medication in order to take the patient from a wide-awake state to a state of drowsiness. At this time we ask psychologically oriented questions that enable us to obtain, in a brief time, information that might otherwise require many weeks of counseling interviews. The rehabilitation interviews also allow the medical staff to monitor the level of aversion for all types of addictive drugs including alcohol.

In addition, our standard treatment approach employs education about the addictive disease and how to live drug free for the patient and family.

The patient spends ten days in treatment (after detoxification if needed). During that time the patient receives five aversion treatments, four rehabilitation interviews, one relaxation treatment, intensive education, group and individual counseling. The patient and the counselor formulate an aftercare plan for the patient that will also include two return visits to the hospital. These return visits are usually done at about the 30 day and then 90 day interval after discharge. The purpose of these visits is to monitor the patient's aversion and reinforce it. The patient also sees a counselor at this time to see what progress is being made on the continuing care plan. We also keep in contact with the patient by telephone for two years after treatment to help monitor their progress.

This program is brief compared to many other treatment approaches, which involve one month to 3 months or more inpatient care. Because of the nature of our treatment program and its intensity, it is provided in a hospital setting where medical supervision is provided.

MEDICAL PROGRAM

- » Complete Physical examination
